

## To Obtain KMC CME Credit -

1. Go to the **KHN CME Website:**

2. Click on “Obtain Event Credit “ in the left margin.


3. Enter an email address. **First time users click “I am a new user” and follow steps 4-6. Returning users skip to 6.**

4. Enter the event code and “Sign In”.

5. Complete the information on the next 2 screens and hit “Continue”.

6. Enter your password with the event code and “Sign In”.

7. Complete the evaluation and “Submit”.

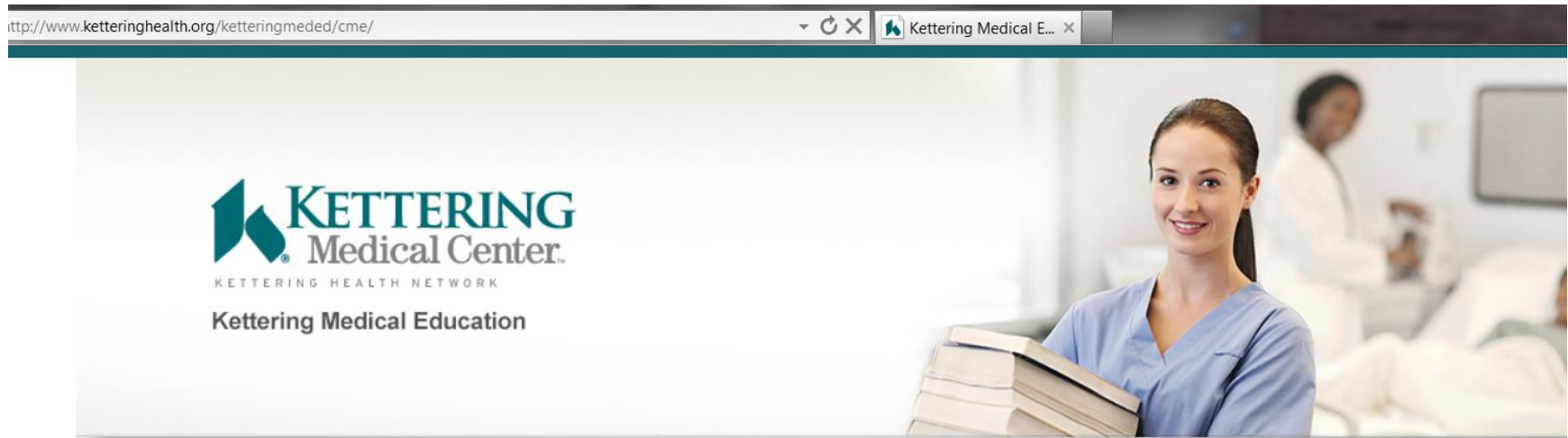
